**Presentation Rubric**

When you present a problem in class, you will be given a score from 0–3 based on the following rubric.

Points	Qualifications
0	Student does not have a solution to the assigned problem.
1	Student has a worked solution for the assigned problem. However, the solution is wrong or has serious errors.
2	Student has a correct solution for the assigned problem. However, the solution has minor errors or omissions.
3	Student presents a correct and complete solution to the assigned problem.

You do not need to have a majority of 3's to pass the class. This class is about learning how to solve problems. Sometime you will have an incorrect or incomplete answer and that is part of the process of learning. However, I would strongly warn against having multiple 0's. A 0 is only given if you do not bring an attempt at solving the problem to class<sup>1</sup>. This is not part of the learning process and is much worse than getting a 1.
